# INTRODUCTION

HYPE is a catalyst, using experience and networking to transform the lives of disadvantaged children and young people. We develop, fund and support learning programmes at every stage of a young person's development regardless of social background. HYPE transformers the landscape of opportunities for young people.

Our Vibrant Schools project is designed to educate pupils about eating healthily, growing and nurturing, but also about the importance of working together collectively to achieve positive outcomes.

At the forefront of all our projects are the children and young people we work with in any club, community or school.

HYPE delivers a range of youth activities tailor-made for young people and the variety of barriers they face. We specialise in supporting young people aged between 7 and 24 years, who are living in highly deprived neighbourhoods where opportunities are limited.

Realising the impact of what we do, HYPE has 3 set impact goals:

- 1. Create more opportunities for young people
- 2. Support young people to reach their potential
- 3. Strengthen local communities

# **VIBRANT ST CUTHBERT'S**

In January 2019, HYPE started work with St Cuthbert's Catholic High School to implement our Vibrant Schools Project.

Having an initial Consultation Day with the teachers and pupils allowed everyone to have a voice in the development at their school and shaped the delivery of the project.

From this initial engagement with **60 pupils**, we formulated a 4 zone project, encompassing:

GROW AREA

ART WALL

WILDLIFE GARDEN RECYCLE ZONE



# GROW AREA

HYPE transformed the space outside the canteen into a growing area for fruit, vegetables and herbs. Pupils were involved in choosing what they wanted to see growing in the area, painting and decorating the planters, planting and maintaining growth.

### **WILDLIFE GARDEN**

HYPE updated a fenced green space into a garden with various plants to attract butterflies, birds and bees. Pupils researched seeds and plants to attract wildlife, built and decorated planters and maintained the garden.

# **ART WALL**

HYPE enhanced the look of the playground through developing the Art Wall, enhanced by further planters. Pupils were involved in designing and making the planters, coming up with ideas for the Art Wall and incorporating their designs in to it.

### **RECYCLE ZONE**

HYPE incorporated the Recycle Zone into the communal break out area, which was often littered with bottles, wrappers and other snack food remnants. Pupils researched ways to decrease littering around the school and delivered a social action day focusing on litter.

# **IMPACT**

When we designed the Vibrant Schools project, we knew what impact we wanted to achieve from our activities:

- ✓ Deliver activities which can enhance the level of engagement between pupils and school life
- ✓ Build resilience and promote healthy relationships and communication between pupils, teachers and family
- ✓ Develop life-long skills which can be used outside of school and carried into the future
- ✓ Increase confidence and self-esteem through shared activities such as gardening and crafts
- ✓ Raise aspirations through activities which open children's eyes to their local environment and neighbourhoods

In order to identify our impact, we introduced a number of methods of measurement:







# **OUR SURVEY SAYS....**

- ✓ There was a 20% increase in pupils understanding more about planting and growing
- ✓ There was a 10% increase in pupils understanding more about the environment
- √ 73% of pupils felt that they took part in activities which involved team work
- √ 86% of pupils felt that they sometimes or always ate healthy and took part in physical exercise
- ✓ There was a 26% increase in pupils feeling more confident when doing new things



Wellbeing Value allows us to measure the success of our social interventions by how much it increases the wellbeing of the people and communities we work with. We do this through using HACT Value Insight (hact.org.uk).

The overall social value generated through the project is £394,355 with a Social Return on Investment recorded as 1:19.72, which means that for every £1 invested into the project, a social return of £19.72 is generated.

31 pupils improved diet & exercise

38 pupils improved their skills

25 pupils were more socially engaged
